In the spring of 2016 *Elect Her* will come to four California Campuses; Saddleback College, San Jose State University, Sierra College, and University of Redlands/Crafton Hills College. Congratulations to everyone involved in bringing this wonderful program to these campuses.

Elect Her is the only program in the country that encourages and trains college women to run for student government and future political office. A collaboration between AAUW and Running

Start, *Elect Her* addresses the need to expand the pipeline of women candidates and to diminish the longstanding political leadership gender gap.

Elect Her is a one-day, 4.5-hour training. Campus administrators, students, and local AAUW members collaborate with AAUW and Running Start staff to plan the trainings each year. <u>Fifty campuses</u> will host *Elect Her* sessions in 2016. Public Policy

Two of our priority bills on equal pay/anti-discrimination were vetoed by the Governor: AB 1017 (would prohibit employers from seeking past salary history when hiring); and AB 1354 (would establish an anti-discrimination program for state contractors).

A third equal pay bill was signed by the Governor and chaptered: SB 358 (prohibits wage discrimination based on gender). NOW is leading an effort to expand SB 358 and add to the classes covered by it's protection. AAUW is considering joining with NOW in this effort.

Membership continues to share the top 10 ways AAUW CA branches brought in new members last year. This month we feature #2 Welcoming, involving, mentoring new members (who bring in more new members) and #7 Providing a wide variety of Interest Groups.

Monterey Peninsula - "Our newest members are also encouraging friends to join, and we have gotten a few new members that way."

"We encourage new members to:

1. Take on a job which will involve them further in AAUW.

2. Participate in an interest group, such as the book groups or gourmet food group."

Laguna Beach - "Our interest groups, such as book groups, art tours, monthly programs and community involvement -e.g. tutoring at an elementary school--have helped to keep new members engaged and enthusiastic."

Healdsburg - "Our branch has a wide variety of interest groups, including bridge, hiking, book groups, Great Decisions." "Happy members are good recruiters."

Big Bear "We have added activities with diversity to appeal to as many women as we can in our valley ...such things are outdoor activities, craft classes, etc. ... social events which offer time for our members to network, meet each other, share time together and become friends."

Santa Clarita ".. lots of different activities that attract people for different reasons - avid readers, math/science geeks,etc." ..more welcoming to new members, introducing them at events, pairing them up with someone to talk to at events, just being a really friendly group." .. "getting new members involved when they first join, while they are enthusiastic, and they in turn are recruiting their friends." ". ... very welcoming to new members and get them involved in our other activities such as Bridge and our Discussion Group as well as our general meetings." **Riverside -** "We assign mentors to get acquainted with new members and bring them to board meetings and interest group meetings."

Redlands - "We greet guests at each branch meeting with a pre-printed name badge and a welcome packet of material including a branch brochure listing the branch interest groups and topics for branch meetings."

La Mesa-El Cajon - "We hold a new member wine/cheese during the winter/spring. We do not invite our members - just newbies and our President and those in charge of special activities. We have each new member give their educational background and why they joined our Branch and then we ask what specific activity they have joined (bridge, reading groups, etc)."
