Membership continues to share the top 10 ways AAUW CA branches brought in new members last year.

This month #3 - Participating in Community events/programs and. #9 - Outreaching to Community Leaders, National Members, targeted groups and prospective members through flyers and email are featured.

- The Healdsburg Branch "created a lecture series, The Forum, after a lifelong learning institute needed to back out of our community. It's not only an excellent fundraiser; it has increased our exposure in the community."
- The Morgan Hill, Fallbrook, & San Jose Branches "Set up a recruitment booth/table at Community events." Morgan Hill also has "members attend the Chamber of Commerce monthly mixers." San Jose has "events like Strong Girls/Strong Women, which involved AAUW working with various community groups."
- **Victor Valley Branch** "participated in A Women's History Project at the local community college."
- **Redlands Branch** "works with the local library on a program called CHAT (Conversation Helps Adults Transition). This program provides conversation partners to educated adults who need to improve their English conversation skills. Many of these CHAT partners have also joined AAUW."
- Oakland-Piedmont Branch tries "to have a presence at community events and our Children's Summer Programs Fair is widely known and attracts parents and vendors from a wide area around the San Francisco Bay. Many of our members put in hours of service on this which creates camaraderie. We also have a core group of school volunteers who staff the library and work in the STEM lab at an impoverished school."
- Santa Clarita Branch has a "Mystery Lit group that meets at our local Barnes and Noble. It is open to the public and B&N puts up posters about it. From this group we invite people to join AAUW. Many are newcomers to our area and are looking for companionship with fellow college graduates."
- The Half Moon Bay Branch has "a showcase at the Half Moon Bay Library during the month of August" which shares the AAUW Mission, website, branch activities and features invitations to special programs.
- The Riverside Branch "sends out flyers to all our city officials, National Members, and nearly all organizations in our city and surrounding areas. We send them every month for our mission based programs."

Many branches have had success recruiting National Members by sending a handwritten, personal invitation to branch meetings and also including them in the newsletter emailing.
