

Quilt auction will fund scholarship

Sew What, a subgroup of AAUW Redlands Branch, as has designed and sewn a quilt that they will auction to the public soon, with the proceeds going to AAUW's Nancy Yowell Scholarshin.

This scholarship honors a former Redlands Branch member, and is for women with previous college experience, whose schooling was interrupted and who have now returned to school to complete their degree program.

Women in Banning, Beaumont, Calimesa, Cherry Valley, Grand Terrace, Highland, Loma Linda, Mentone, Redlands and Yucaipa are eligible for this scholarship.

The name of the quilt is "The Starring Role of Friendship."

It features the friendship star block pattern (a four-pointed triangular star) in a palette of black, red, gray and white. The quilt measures 69 inches by 78 inches and has 30 friendship stars.

"The Sew What quilting group wanted to make this friendship star auilt to represent our personal sisterhood friendships and our special relationships with young women scholars we support in our local community colleges," said member Lisa McCarty.

"The quilt symbolizes our AAUW goal of advancing equity for women and girls through education. Each star stands for the close bond that forms when one woman helps lift another: Bidding details and the date of the auction



#### Membership Matters: 2023/24 Renewal Options

Your 2023/24 membership dues are \$123, which includes \$72 National, \$20 CA State and \$31 Redlands Branch\*. There are four ways to renew your dues. Choose the easiest option for you!

#### Option 1: Renew at a Branch Meeting

Renew in person by cash or check without a fee. If paying by credit card, there is a \$4.00 processing fee.

#### Option 2: Renew by Check in the Mail

There is no fee to renew your membership by check in the mail.

Make your \$123 check payable to AAUW Redlands, then send it to:

AAUW Redlands, c/o Ellen Cope, P.O. Box 7678, Redlands, 92375-0678.

#### Option 3: Renew on the AAUW Redlands Branch Website with a Credit Card.

There is a \$4.00 credit card processing fee to renew on the Redlands branch website.

To pay on our Redlands website: \(\text{\sigma}\) (Sick on the Membership tab, then click on Membership Renewal.

#### Option 4: Renew on the National AAUW Website with a Credit Card

There is no fee to renew on the National AAUW website.

To pay on the National website: Visit AAUW.org and click on Login. If you have visited the Community Hub before and have already created a password, you can log into your Personal Snapshot. If you have not set up your password yet, click Forgot Your Password iocated below the blue login button at the bottom of the page. Enter your email address, then click Reset Your Password to receive a login email from infos/@auw.org. If you don't receive it in 5-10 minutes, email connect@auw.org. PLEASE DO NOT CREATE a NEW ACCOUNT, even if you have never set up a National account before. National has already done that for you. After you receive the login email, enter your email address and "Create and Confirm your Password" to access your Personal Snapshot.

Once you are in your Personal Snapshot, have your credit card handy and click RENEW at the bottom of the screen to renew your national, branch and state memberships. Dual members should self-renew ALL memberships at once. College/University representatives whose national membership is covered by the school should email commet@Balau.wo for request a social code before renewing.

All Redlands branch members who joined prior to February 2022 have a renewal deadline of June 30, 2024.

Members who joined March 2022 or later have a renewal deadline that is 12 months after the month they joined.

  - Gov Trek strong link to mission, minimal heavy lifting, good publicity, no cost
  - Tech Trek strong link to mission, pre-defined processes, great opportunity for publicity
- What are our current resources
  - Who are your Excel users, members who can ask for sponsorships, organizers, etc.
- Who will own which efforts
  - How can we engage all members; spread out the workload
- Celebrate successes no matter how seemingly small
