

Students in the state finals will be competing for awards of \$2500, \$2000, \$1000, and two honorable mentions of \$500 each. That's worth the sweaty palms. The 2024-2025 topic concerns climate change and its impact on women. The details and necessary forms for your branch to participate are HERE; the deadline to sign up is November 18th. This will be the final year for the Speech Trek program. Make it a big one.



100! It's an ugly number when it's the daytime temperature. It's a lovely number when it's on U.S. currency. For us, it's the rewarding number of branches that sent girls to Tech Trek in 2024. That means nearly every branch in the state committed time, energy, and a boatload of \$100 bills to give 800 girls a once-in-a-lifetime experience at an in-person or virtual camp. They ate generally-identifiable cafeteria food and slept in curiously-sized dorm beds or Zoomed in wearing flannel pajama bottoms emblazoned with kitty cats. And thanks to Program Director Mary Isaac and more than 250 staff, they learned, laughed, and leaned into their interest in STEM. How many \$100 bills was that worth? Priceless. But you knew we'd say that.



We put our money where our mouth is. So far, AAUW has granted more than \$146 million to 14,000 women and nonprofit organizations to pursue work that will drive social change. That's almost as much as the receipt from your last trip to Costco®. This year's national Fellowships & Grants program offers more grant opportunities than you can shake a stick at. 
Things to Do
