But they're here at last and, as the proverb promises, good things come to those who wait. The updated websites are clean-looking, full of links and buttons, and more customizable by branch webmasters. Not all branches use National's platform, but for those that do, it's an E Ticket ride.



Gone are the days when you could pay your taxes with a goat. You won't find many Toggenburgers in general circulation. You have to use real money (or Bitcoin if you actually understand how that works). So you might as well at least reduce your tax bill by donating to your favorite charitable organization. Just be sure the donation is paid directly from the IRA to the charity and is received by the qualified charity by the end of the year.
