What is Public Policy?

- Public Policy work consists of developing and implementing certain courses of action designed to advocate for an organization's policy priorities
- Individuals and groups often attempt to shape public policy through education, advocacy, or mobilization of interest groups.
 The process always involves efforts by competing interest groups to influence policy makers in their favor



• This process is necessarily *political* ("decision-making about distribution of resources or policy selection by those in power"). This is *not* the same as *partisan*, which involves the decision to support or oppose a particular candidate based on their party identification. We are non-partisan, but we are not apolitical.





What is the Purpose of Having PPPs?

- 1. Statement of what we stand for
 - a. Membership
 - b. Outside world
- 2. Establishes our legislative priorities
 - a. Guides our decisions re bills to support/oppose
 - b. Guides our positions on governmental policy decisions
- 3. Must be in line with National
 - a. Need not mirror
 - b. BUT cannot be in conflict
 - c. Should not establish broad national agendas upon which National has not spoken
- 4. Are NOT for the purpose of developing programs to carry out our policies
- 5. Should be broad enough to encompass all contingencies within each policy's subject matter





What is the Basis for AAUW California's Public Policy Priorities?

Our Mission Statement:
 To advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education and research.

2. AAUW National's Policy Directives:

- a. Basic to all of AAUW's public policy efforts is the understanding that true equity requires a balance between the rights of the individual and the needs of the community. AAUW opposes all forms of discrimination and supports constitutional protection for the civil rights of all individuals.
- b. We work to increase the number of women, and the diversity of backgrounds they represent, including race, ethnicity, age, income, gender, and sexual identity, in policy- and other decision-making positions.
- c. Our positions are shaped by our commitment to being nonpartisan and fact-based, and to acting with integrity.
- d. We strive for our work to be inclusive and intersectional, collaborating with diverse allies and coalitions to achieve equity for all.





How are They Determined?

- 1. Revised every two years with input from membership
- 2. Survey goes to all members requesting comments on all existing priorities
 - a. Keep (vast majority)
 - b. Eliminate (very few)
 - c. Modify request for suggested modified language
- 3. State Public Policy Committee reviews all suggestions, applies following criteria:
 - a. Request to "Add" a new priority
 - i. Is it within our mission?
 - ii. Does it address a new issue germane to current circumstances?
 - iii. Would adding it meet the criteria set forth in the "Purpose"?
 - b. Request to "Delete"
 - i. What's the basis for the request?
 - ii. Would deleting it diminish our ability to meet the "Purpose"?
 - c. Request to "Modify"
 - i. Would the modification/s alter the basic import of the priority?
 - ii. Does the modification/s fit the criteria in the "Purpose"?
