Last month we told you we would be sharing the top 10 ways AAUW CA branches brought in new members this year. We started with #10. This month we are skipping to #6: Using social media, website, Facebook, developing interesting newsletters. This story came from a member.

My daughter, a University Graduate, late 40's, 4 daughters (2 in college, 2 in high school), recently moved to California. She has been involved in elementary school PTAs and has "been there, done that". After being a stay at home Mom for 21 years, she's trying to re-enter the workforce and having a hard time. I've been trying to interest her in AAUW as a way to meet like-minded women, make friends of her own and become involved in the community. So, we

looked at [Find A Branch](#) on the AAUW-CA website to see which branch in her area (there were 4) might be the best fit for her.

One didn't have a website so we had no way to contact them except to send an email to Membership.

The second did have a website but no pictures, no information about activities except date of next board meeting and date and place of the next general meeting but no information about the program. The Mission Statement, the Value promise and the Vision statement were listed but no information about how the branch addresses these. There was a link to the newsletter, but for members only.

A third had a link to a website that had been disabled.

The fourth had a website that included information about projects and activities, a calendar, newsletter, pictures showing a diverse membership, open invitation to a new members event, lots of information about interest groups & when they meet, a membership form to print and send in and an online one too. The only thing missing was a link to a facebook page.

Which one do you think she wants to investigate?

We keep saying that we need to attract new younger, diverse members. This demographic has lots of choices and will naturally be attracted to an organization that looks lively, energetic, mission based and welcoming. This might also be a good time to review your bylaws to see if any other amendments would be wise, particularly if you are having trouble filling all your required board positions or are considering a new governance structure. Everything you need can be found on the [Branch Governance](#) page (under Branch Support): a list of state [governance committee representatives](#) (so you know who to contact), easy-to-follow step-by-step [instructions on the mandatory amendments](#), and updated [model branch bylaws](#) (and [policies and procedures](#)). The model documents show all current and past mandated language, as well as tips for best practices in the areas where branches have flexibility in writing their bylaws.
